In 1937, Bing Crosby invited a group of friends to get together for some golf, a clambake and, most importantly, to raise money for local charities. Since that time, the tournament, now known as the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am, has become one of the most popular and internationally recognized stops on the PGA TOUR and the spirit of giving back has continued through the Monterey Peninsula Foundation. Since the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am came to the Monterey Peninsula in 1947, over \$86 million has been raised for nonprofit organizations in Monterey County and surrounding communities.

Since 2004, more than 7,000 youth have participated in The First Tee programs throughout Monterey County.
